Rules and Guidelines



CARIBBEAN STUD POKER

Caribbean Stud is based on five card stud, a variation of Poker. The game is played with a single deck of 52 cards. The game is made more challenging and exciting because players have the additional chance to win a progressive Jackpot Payout, via a side wager.

HOW TO PLAY

1. Before the cards are dealt, players must place an 'Ante' bet. Also at this time an additional side wager may be placed on the Progressive Jackpot.
2. This Progressive Jackpot bet is independent of the game, although to participate in the jackpot, players must have an 'Ante' bet.
3. After dealer announces "NO MORE BETS", five cards are dealt to each player.
4. After all the cards have been dealt, the players pick up their cards and decide if they wish to 'Bet' or 'Fold'. Players are not permitted to talk or communicate while looking at their cards.
5. If you think that your hand will beat the Dealer and you want to play the hand, you must make another bet that is exactly double your original 'Ante' and place it in the 'Bet' area.
6. If you do not want to play the hand, you must 'Fold' by placing your cards face down on the table and your 'Ante' bet is taken by the Dealer.
7. Once all players have set their 'Bets' or 'Folded', the Dealer then turns his/ her cards.
8. If the Dealer does not have an Ace and King or better (qualifies), all players 'Ante's' are paid at even money. After all 'Ante's' are paid, the Dealer checks each hand in turn for jackpots.
9. If the Dealer qualifies and your hand beats the Dealer, you are paid even money for the 'Ante' and the appropriate odds for the 'Bet'.
10. Should the Dealer's hand beat your hand, the Dealer shall take both your 'Bet' and the 'Ante'.
11. When your hand qualifies for a jackpot payout, the Dealer will pay the jackpot amount after your 'Bet' and 'Ante' have been paid.



PROGRESSIVE JACKPOT PAYOUTS

Regardless of the Dealer's hand, a player who has a qualifying jackpot hand, wins the jackpot amount appropriate to that hand. When the Dealer does not qualify, the player wins the jackpot amount only. If the Dealer's hand qualifies and does not beat the player, the player will win both the odds and the jackpot amount up to the maximum amount payable.

* Players can win only one jackpot per hand

BET PAYOUTS

'Ante'	All 'Ante' bets	1 to 1	(even money)
'Bet'	One pair or less	1 to 1	(up to a maximum payout)
	Two Pairs	2 to 1	(up to a maximum payout)
	Three-of-a-Kind	3 to 1	(up to a maximum payout)
	Straight	4 to 1	(up to a maximum payout)
	Flush	5 to 1	(up to a maximum payout)
	Full House	7 to 1	(up to a maximum payout)
	Four of a Kind	20 to 1	(up to a maximum payout)
	Straight Flush	50 to 1	(up to a maximum payout)
	Royal Flush	100 to 1	(up to a maximum payout)
