


BLACKJACK Rules and Guidelines

AIM OF THE GAME

The aim of Blackjack is to be dealt a hand that has a value greater than that of the Dealer without exceeding 21. If you win, you are paid even money. If your point total is the same as the Dealer, then the result is a Stand Off and you don't win or lose on that hand. Your hand will lose if your point total is less than the Dealer's or greater than 21.




EXAMPLE OF HANDS:

HAND TOTALS

Blackjack is achieved when the first two cards dealt to your hand are an Ace and any card with a value of 10. Blackjack is paid at the odds of 3 to 2. Should the Dealer also make Blackjack during the same round of play, then the result is a Stand Off.

HOW TO PLAY BLACKJACK

Simply place your bet in one of the betting areas marked on the Blackjack table. Up to three bets may be placed in any one betting area. The Dealer will deliver two cards face up to each betting area that contains a bet, and one card face up to himself. Each player at the table then acts on their hand in turn, starting from the Dealer's left. Once all players have acted on their hands, the Dealer will draw cards as required to complete their hand.



BETTING OPTIONS

Blackjack offers a number of betting options to the Player, including Double Down, Splitting, Insurance or Surrender.

Double Down

An additional bet that is up to the value of your original bet. You may double on your first two cards, except when you are dealt a Blackjack. When doubling, you receive only one additional card on your hand. Dealer takes original bets only when dealers hand is Blackjack.

Splitting

When your first two cards dealt to your hand are of the same value, you may place an additional bet equal in value to your original bet and split the hand. You can split up to two times to create a maximum of three hands, unless splitting aces, which may only be split once to form two hands.

Insurance

When the first card dealt to the Dealer is an Ace, you may "insure" your bet against the Dealer making a Blackjack. Your insurance bet may be up to the value of your original bet and is paid at the odds of 2 to 1 if the Dealer achieves a Blackjack. If the Dealer does not get a Blackjack, the insurance bet loses.

Surrender

You may elect to surrender your hand after receiving your first two cards and lose half of your original wager. You cannot surrender when the Dealer's card is an Ace.

ANY PAIR BETS

An addition wager on Blackjack giving you the option to place an extra bet that your first two cards will be of "Any Pair" betting options.

HOW TO PLAY PAIRS

Simply place a bet in addition to your original Blackjack bet on the area of the table marked "Any Pair" or "Perfect Pair". You may also be permitted to place a pair bet on any other pairs betting area provided there is a valid Blackjack wager placed in that betting area. If the first two cards dealt to you is a pair, you win and will be paid at the odds of 11 to 1.

OVER/UNDER 13 BETS

Over/Under 13 on Blackjack is another betting option for an additional bet on the first two initial cards.

HOW TO PLAY OVER/UNDER 13 BETS

Over/Under 13 wagers can be placed in conjuction with a Blackjack wager or on its own; wagering that the initial two cards of a player's hand will be greater or less but not equal to 13. All winning wagers are paid at the odds of 1 to 1. Where the initial two cards are dealt totals 13, the Over/Under wager loses. Ace will have a value of one only.
